Not Alone

"It's so hard when mothers think that they are alone, that they don't have anything," says Giovanna, a mother of three, including a set of twins. "But then you see that you are not alone. You can come to this organization and receive help. Then you find you don't need to worry about how to buy diapers or clothes."

The mothers like Giovanna who come to Hope Supply Co. are survivors. They have weathered some of the harshest storms of life but have been able to stay afloat through their own tenacity and resourcefulness, and with the help of others.

They include women like Maria, another mother of three, who found Hope Supply through a family member after she had hit a rough spot. "We were having trouble with bills and paying for everyday things," she explains. "From the very first day, everybody was very kind and understanding."

For many mothers like them, the help they've received through Hope Supply has sometimes seemed "too good to be true," as Giovanna puts it. She adds, "When you have the support of this organization, you think, 'I can make it.'"



Reaching Moms, Serving Babies

Where moms are, babies are, which makes the partnership between the program extending Maternal Care after Pregnancy (eMCAP) and Hope Supply Co. a win-win endeavor.

eMCAP is a community-based program jointly operated by UT Southwestern Medical Center and Parkland Health. It was created to address health care disparities among new mothers, and the program's mobile unit allows eMCAP to reach many who would otherwise be overlooked. "For many of these moms, pregnancy is the only time they really will go to the doctor in any kind of routine fashion," explains Tocovia Ingram, RN, a nurse home visitor with eMCAP. "Our program has really been to enlighten moms on the importance of follow-up care, especially in that first year after."

From the initial planning for the eMCAP program, organizers knew that families would need broader care and have more expansive needs than eMCAP would be able to address. Hope Supply Co. was pleased to become a part of the program's network in 2022. Through this partnership, HSC has provided more than 250,000 diapers.

"It is so important to make sure both baby and mom are supported," says Laura Montalvo, program manager for Hope Supply. "Knowing eMCAP works to make that happen from delivery through a full year makes it a program that we've been excited to supply with diapers, wipes and hygiene kits."


